## THE MMVHS QUALITY OF LIFE SCALE

Quality of life (QOL) scoring helps take subjective thoughts about your beloved pet and puts them into a more objective framework. When a pet is coping with a terminal illness or they are declining due to old age, assessing QOL may be helpful to decide if palliative care should be pursued or humane euthanasia elected. Each of the 14 categories below is scored between 5 points (considered good/normal) down to 0 points (considered as poor as can be). Read each section and mark each score on the right side of the page, adding up the numbers on the right side for a total out of 70 , then multiply by 100 to give your final QOL score. When scoring each section, start each sentence with "MY PET IS"...

## QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF



Breathing normally and has a resting respiratory rate of $<30$ breaths /minute.
Breathing with severe difficulty $+/-$ coughing, wheezing, open mouth breathing. There is a diagnosed underlying disease affecting the lungs (eg: congestive heart failure, lung cancer, laryngeal paralysis).

Not showing any obvious signs of pain.
Showing severe signs of pain - acute or chronic. My pet is not on any medication and/or current meds are not working well. Signs of pain may include not jumping on couch, unable to do stairs, unable to sit or lie down easily, moans, not using the litter box, not going for regular walks, seems very stiff when simply walking.

Eating well with a good/normal appetite. I don't need to coax him/her to eat or drink. Not eating at all +/- not drinking.


Showing normal interest in the daily routine/activities.
No longer interacting with other pets/family members. He/she prefers to be alone, is no longer greeting people at the door, doesn't play games with toys or chew bones. He/she is not curious and is lethargic.
